Oyekunle, FNSE, was ably represented by the Technical Secretary, Engr Uchechi Edosomwan, FNSE, who doubled as one of the judges in the final competition. The Assistant Publicity Secretary, Engr Olamitope Abosede, MNSE was also in attendance.

After weeks of inspiring presentations, the top 4 finalists showcased ground-breaking AI-driven innovations. This was a witness of creativity, technology and sustainable innovations at its best.

A team of young engineers, Onyishi Dennis Ejike and Nwamkpa Ejike Chukwuma, who designed An AI & ML-powered Agricultural robot for smart agriculture in Nigeria, won the star prize of one million naira. The second prize winner (AI smart plate vision: Nigerian License Plate Detection and Recognition system (NLPDRS) went with seven hundred thousand naira while the 3rd went home with five hundred thousand naira. This was a laudable initiative that would remain a beacon of hope for the upcoming engineers.

The chapter held a public lecture titled – Racing for Air; every breath matters on September 10th, 2025 which was delivered by Engr Olulade Odu-Onikosi, the General Manager of Environquest limited.

She stated that although air is invisible, it shapes every moment of our lives. She opined that sadly, in Nigeria today, the air we breathe is often toxic and in some locations, it can equate to smoking several cigarettes a day. From her lecture, it was clear that the pollution was mainly caused by aging vehicles, low fuel quality, the open burning of waste, weak waste disposal systems and emissions from factories, industrial activities and over 22 million small generators that power homes and businesses. Together, these sources make the air heavy and dangerous, especially in urban centers like Lagos, Onitsha, and Kaduna according to the presenter.

Despite the almost bleak picture painted, she said that although the air was unsafe, the bigger issue was awareness as most communities had no idea they were breathing polluted air daily. She added that it was invisible, but deadly leading to asthma and other diseases.

In her words, she said, “Clean air is not just an environmental issue; it’s a development issue. Clean air is not a privilege but a right and the air we share should unite us, not choke us.” She concluded by stating that to achieve blue skies requires a cocktail of strong policies and strong public action in 3 levels- citizens, businesses and government.
